Legislation is moving through both the Assembly (A3309) and Senate (S3058) that would require parents and teens to attend a Parent and Teen Orientation Program prior to a teen driving permit being issued. This training is designed to meet that requirement. The orientation program is now called *Sharing the Keys*.

Sharing the Keys is approximately 90 minutes in length and designed for both parents and teens. It is a research based, data-driven program, designed to reduce teen crashes by increasing parental knowledge and involvement.

While researchers have found that Graduated Driver License (GDL) laws are the single most effective tool for helping to reduce teen driver crashes, injuries, and fatalities, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and State Farm Insurance Company have also found that teens who have parents who set rules and monitor their driving activities in a helpful and supportive way are half as likely to be involved in a crash, 71% less likely to drive intoxicated and 30% less likely to use a cell phone while driving.

The SJTSA is sponsoring this SHARE THE KEYS Parent/Teen Driver Program Instructor Training Workshop for school and law enforcement personnel. The SJTSA will continue to be available for assistance and guidance. Certificates of completion will be issued to those who have successfully completed the group presentation. **Early registration is recommended; space is limited to thirty participants.**
